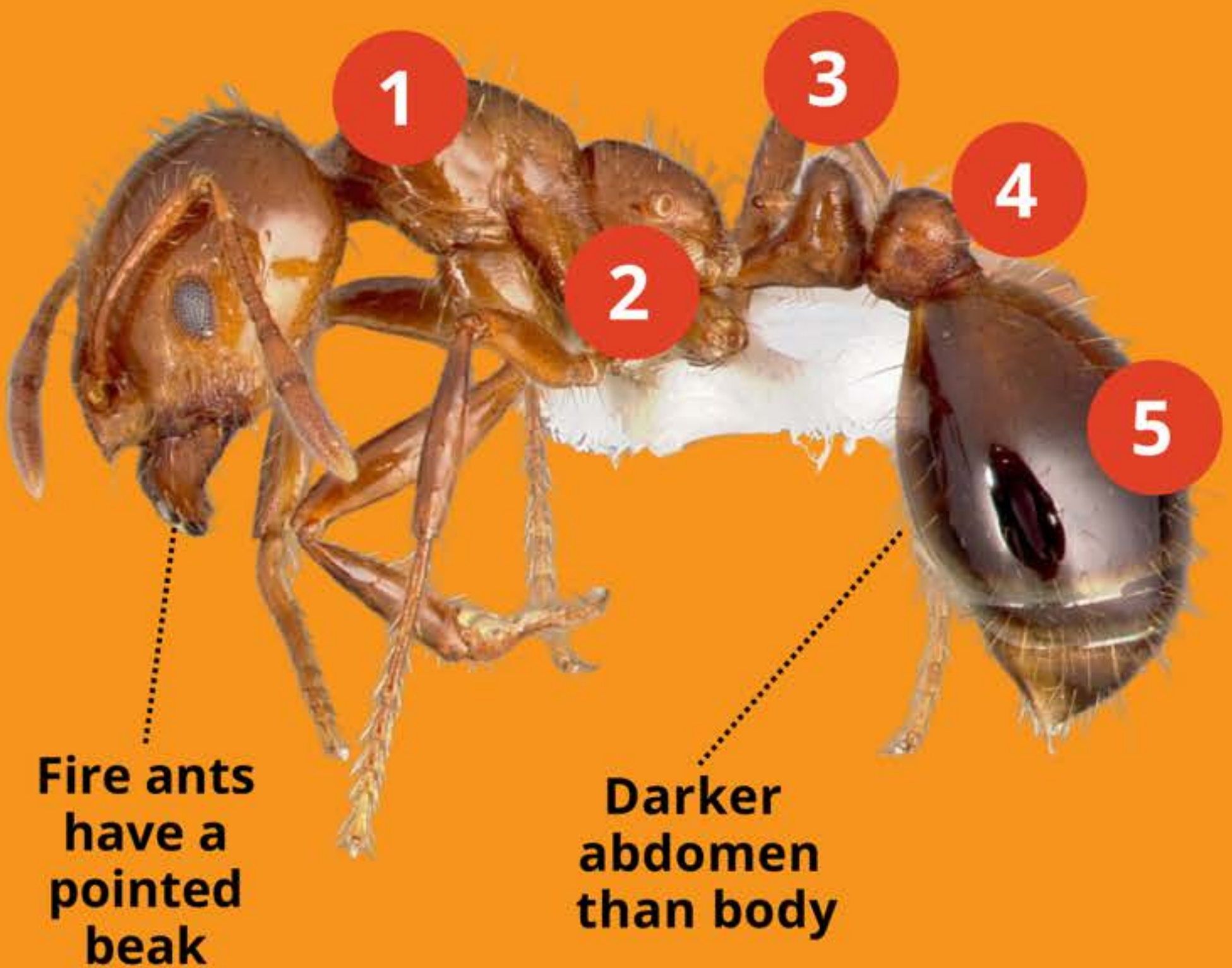

Features of the fire ant

The coppery brown body of a fire ant has five segments.



FIRE ANT FACT

When disturbed, fire ants will rush to the surface of the nest and swarm.

Fire ant size

**Fire ants are small.
Each ant is only
2 - 6mm long.**



**There will be
multiple-sized fire
ants in one nest.**

Stings



Pus welts



Fire ants have a sting that can leave a burning or itching sensation on the skin.

If you experience symptoms of a severe allergic or anaphylactic reaction to fire ants, call 000 immediately.

Nests

Fire ant nests can appear as dome-shaped mounds or be flat and look like a small patch of disturbed soil.



They are often found in open areas such as lawns, pastures, unused cropland or along roadsides.

Fire ants spread relatively slowly on their own but people moving organic material can spread them further and faster.

- **Manure**
- **Turf**
- **Potted plants**
